### LEADER OF THE PACK

The Velociraptor (shown on page 3) is a small predatory carnivore that hunts in packs. The "raptor" is approximately 6 ft. tall, weighing 150 to 350 pounds. A large-brained animal that is more intelligent than most dinosaurs, it has a distinctive three-fingered hand, ending in curved and dangerous claws. Its skin is leathery, with a pebbled texture.

Look for the raptors in their pen at the back of the Visitors' Center...but Proceed With Caution.



The Brachiosaurus (pictured here) is one of the most massive dinosaurs in history, measuring almost 74 ft. long and weighing as much as 77 tons. An herbivore who feeds from the tops of tall trees, the most obvious feature of this creature is the great length of its neck. The nostrils on top of the head are a puzzling attribute.

You're likely to spot several Brachiosaurus as you first arrive in the park. Look to the sky and you'll see them nibbling on the tops of trees. Fortunately, the brachs are very gentle creatures, who will enjoy watching you as much as you'll like seeing them!






